



## **FAQ's**

### **What is the Antebellum Trail?**

Georgia's Antebellum Trail is the state's oldest recognized Trail which celebrated its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2009. It began as a University of Georgia student project and resulted in the Athens Chamber of Commerce calling together the historic communities of Athens, Watkinsville, Madison, Eatonton, Milledgeville, Gray/Old Clinton and Macon.

### **What is the Antebellum Trail Pilgrimage?**

Comprised of seven communities, this self-guided Pilgrimage will transport visitors back in time as they visit historic homes, experience authentic battle sites, view impressive architecture and tour magnificent museums. It will also feature events and tours along the Trail.

### **When is the Pilgrimage?**

April 21 – 25, 2010. Hours for most locations are 10am – 4pm. Please check itinerary for specific hours of operation and dates they are open.

### **How much are passes?**

The passes are \$25 per person (early bird discount/group rate - \$20 – ends March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2010).

### **Where can I purchase the pass?**

You can either purchase your passes on our website (anytime) or in any of the 6 Welcome Centers along the Trail before and during the Pilgrimage.

### **What does the pass include?**

It includes entrance into 7 attractions/museums/private homes/events, etc. that are participating in the Pilgrimage (known as Punches). It can be used over the course of all 5 days or all in one day until all seven punches are used.

### **What if it rains?**

Most of the participating locations are inside but the Pilgrimage will happen rain or shine!

### **Is there transportation available?**

The Pilgrimage is completely self-guided however, we would be happy to recommend companies that can assist you in this matter.

### **Can a group/organization take the Pilgrimage tour?**

Absolutely! There is a group rate available if you purchase 10 tickets or more. We would be happy to also assist you in developing an itinerary or you can choose your own stops by printing off the itinerary posted online.

### **Will every Pilgrimage participant be open each day?**

The participating locations will vary from day to day. The itineraries posted are also subject to change. It is best to call the Welcome Centers or individual attractions to check hours of operation. The hours of the Pilgrimage are 10am – 4pm.

### **How many years has it been held?**

This is the second year of the Pilgrimage.

### **How many cities are located on the Antebellum Trail Pilgrimage?**

There are six communities: Athens, Watkinsville, Madison, Eatonton, Milledgeville and Macon. Gray/Old Clinton will be located on the Antebellum Trail but will not feature any punch attractions.
